

SEATTLE, WASHINGTON

Begin your journey in the Emerald City—the gateway to the Pacific Northwest and an icon of technological and creative innovation.



Surrounded on all sides by mountains, water and evergreen forests, Seattle's abundant natural beauty is matched only by its wealth of urban attractions.

JUNE 18 From the prime location of Four Seasons Hotel Seattle, enjoy unfettered access to the **Seattle Art Museum**, world-class dining and shopping and **Pike Place Market**, one of the oldest continuously operated public markets. Meet fellow travelers and expedition staff at a welcome dinner.

ACCOMMODATIONS Overlooking shimmering Puget Sound and Elliott Bay, the luxurious downtown **Four Seasons Hotel Seattle** is an easy stroll from the city's most iconic attractions. SEATTLE, WASHINGTON ✈️ PETROPAVLOVSK, RUSSIA: 7H 40M

KAMCHATKA PENINSULA, RUSSIA

Russia's remote Kamchatka Peninsula is an untamed wilderness punctuated by snow-capped volcanoes, steamy hot springs and endemic wildlife.



Venture into the Kamchatka Peninsula, one of the last untouched places on the planet. Few travelers make it to Russia's Far East, but those who do are rewarded with a majestic volcanic setting in a region known as the land of fire and ice.

JUNE 19 - 21 Cross the international date line, losing a day before landing in the Kamchatka Peninsula. No roads or railway lines connect the peninsula to the rest of the continent, making it one of the most remote places on Earth. Learn about the peninsula's **29 active volcanoes**, including one of the largest in the world, from Russian volcanologists accompanying our group.

Opt to climb aboard a six-wheel-drive Russian Kamaz vehicle for a cross-country jaunt to the foot of two spectacular ice-capped volcanoes—**Avachinsky** and **Koryaksky**. Hike along Camel Mountain or simply enjoy lunch in the open air.

Alternatively take a boat cruise along the coast where you can fish for local catch, view seabird colonies and observe indigenous marine animals. Divers bring in delicacies straight from the sea for an on-board tasting.

ACCOMMODATIONS Located near hot springs on the Paratunka River, **Bel-Kam-Tour Hotel** is a popular choice for guests to this remote region. Rest in comfortable guest rooms, relax in one of the hotel's four outdoor thermal pools and enjoy easy access to the Kamchatka Peninsula's many attractions.

PETROPAVLOVSK, RUSSIA ✈️ VLADIVOSTOK, RUSSIA: 3H 10M

VLADIVOSTOK, KHABAROVSK, ULAN-UDE *and* LAKE BAIKAL, RUSSIA

Embark on a four-night Trans-Siberian Railway adventure across the expansive landscapes of the Siberian taiga to Lake Baikal, the world's oldest and deepest lake.



In 1916, the final ties of the Trans-Siberian Railway were laid, linking nearly 6,000 miles between Moscow and the remote reaches of Siberia. Spend four nights on the well-appointed Golden Eagle Train and experience the railway journey of a lifetime.

JUNE 22 - 25 In Vladivostok, explore the complex fortifications at **Vladivostok Fortress** and visit a preserved Soviet S-56 submarine from World War II. Get a birds-eye view of the city from Eagle's Nest Hill before boarding the **Golden Eagle Trans-Siberian Express**, chartered exclusively for our group, in the evening. Our first stop is Khabarovsk, set on the picturesque Amur River near the Chinese border. Visit a massive monument commemorating the exploits of the city's namesake—17th-century explorer Yerofey Khabarov. Examine the impact of World War II at a thoughtful memorial overlooking the river and delve into the region's history at the **Khabarovsk Regional Museum**.

Take in sweeping views of the verdant Siberian boreal forest from the Golden Eagle train. Sample Russia's famed vodkas, enjoy an afternoon tea filled with Russian delicacies and learn a few Russian phrases. The next day we reach Ulan-Ude in Buryatia, a unique region home to both ethnic Russians and Buryats, an indigenous people who practice Buddhism. Step back in time at the **Old Believer's village**, where a small Russian Orthodox community has maintained their traditional way of life for centuries, and enjoy a concert featuring local singers.

As the train approaches Lake Baikal, the world's largest freshwater lake and a UNESCO World Heritage site, stop for panoramic views and a bracing swim before a barbecue lunch on the shores. Transfer by boat to the village of Listvyanka and stop at the **Lake Baikal Museum** to learn about the area's abundant flora and fauna, or opt to take a chair lift up Chersky Mountain for a spectacular view of the lake and its surroundings. Travel to Irkutsk and board our private jet for Mongolia.

ACCOMMODATIONS Harken back to the golden age of train travel aboard the **Golden Eagle Trans-Siberian Express**. Chartered exclusively for our group, the train features well-appointed cabins, fine dining, full bar lounge cars and high-touch service. Watch the remote and expansive Siberian landscape unfold from your en suite cabin and enjoy gourmet meals that incorporate local flavors.

IRKUTSK, RUSSIA ✈ ULAANBAATAR, MONGOLIA: 45M

ULAANBAATAR *and* GOBI DESERT *or* GORKHI-TERELJ NATIONAL PARK, MONGOLIA

Mongolia is one of the few remaining nomadic societies in the world and its ancient traditions thrive amid the country's vast landscapes.



The Mongolian wilderness combines rugged mountains, endless steppes and spectacular sand dunes. Enjoy the stark contrasts between Mongolia's capital city, Ulaanbaatar, and the remote countryside where nomads and camels still roam.

JUNE 26 – 28 In Ulaanbaatar, explore the **Gandan Monastery**, one of the few Buddhist monasteries to survive the Communist regime's religious purges in the 1930s. Today, hundreds of monks make their permanent home at this Tibetan-style monastery, reflecting a resurgence in the open practice of Buddhism.

After a visit to the National History Museum to view its extensive collection of historical artifacts, fly by local air to the Gobi Desert. From craggy mountain peaks to breathtaking sand dunes, the Gobi is filled with a variety of dramatic landscapes. Examine dinosaur fossils at the **Flaming Cliffs**—which get their name from the brilliant shades of orange and red the cliffs turn at sunset—and meet a nomadic camel-raising family at **Moltsog Els**, a 10-mile stretch of sand dunes. Alternatively, opt to hike in **Yolyn Am**, a spectacular gorge with steep walls that echo the sounds of the stream below. Stay in a private *ger*, the traditional portable home of the nomads, for a taste of time-honored Mongolian hospitality.

Alternate: Experience a different side of Mongolia in **Gorkhi-Terelj National Park**, an easy respite from the urban capital. After

exploring the Fine Arts Museum in Ulaanbaatar, travel overland to this protected area with its alpine-like terrain, fascinating rock formations and local wildlife. Explore the spectacular valleys and stunning forests on a hike or on horseback.

ACCOMMODATIONS **Shangri-La Hotel, Ulaanbaatar** is a luxurious sanctuary in Mongolia's capital. Each well-appointed guest room offers panoramic views and boasts a stunning fusion of contemporary and local design styles. In the heart of the Gobi, the **Three Camel Lodge** was built according to sustainable guidelines. Guest rooms are handmade *gers*, or traditional Mongolian felt tents that feature hand-painted, wood-framed furnishings.

Alternate: Surrounded by the forested mountains of the Gorkhi-Terelj National Park, the **Terelj Hotel and Spa** offers a lush retreat in the serene Mongolian wilderness. Enjoy picturesque views from the hotel's beautiful rooms and easy access to the park's attractions.



ULAANBAATAR, MONGOLIA ✈️ RIGA, LATVIA: 7H 35M

RIGA, LATVIA

Founded in the 13th century, the Latvian capital of Riga combines an 800-year history with the irresistible charms of a modern metropolis. An architecture pearl, Riga's historic center is a UNESCO World Heritage site.



Gothic spires, stunning Art Deco buildings and Soviet-style blocks harmoniously coexist in Riga. Since Latvia's independence from the Soviet Union in the 1990s, Riga has reinvented itself as the cultural heart of the Baltics.

JUNE 29 - 30 Take a walking tour of Old Riga and browse the bustling centuries-old **Central Market**, where vendors peddle a cornucopia of produce, meats and cheeses. Opt to visit Swedish Gate, part of a fortification wall built in 1698 and the only one of its kind to survive in its original form. Go behind the scenes at the stately neoclassical **National Opera House**, where Latvia's national ballet and opera companies perform year-round.

Riga is famed for its wealth of Art Nouveau architecture. More than a third of all the structures in the Latvian capital were built at the height of this modernist movement, defined by fantastical embellishments and design elements drawn from nature. Walk through neighborhoods filled with **incredible Art Nouveau façades**, including many designed by legendary architect Mikhail Eisenstein. Continue your exploration at the Riga Art Nouveau Museum, once the apartment of famed Latvian architect Konstantins Peksens, who designed nearly 250 buildings in Riga, including this apartment's grandiose spiral staircase.

Drive to the edge of the Rumbula Forest to view the **Salaspils Memorial**, a moving tribute to those who lost their lives as concentration camp prisoners during World War II. Delve into Latvia's somber history at the ruins of a Jewish synagogue—one of many burnt to the ground during the Nazi occupation.

ACCOMMODATIONS Built in 1877 as the Central Bank of Latvia, the **Grand Palace Hotel** boasts elegantly furnished guest rooms with modern conveniences. This five-star hotel includes a fitness center, steam room, a restaurant with Asian and European fusion cuisine, lounge and summer terrace.

RIGA, LATVIA ✈️ HELSINKI, FINLAND: 30M

HELSINKI, FINLAND

Finland's vibrant capital comes to life during long summer days—the ideal time to soak up Helsinki's lively café culture, historic buildings and urban parks.



Founded in 1550, Helsinki is one of northern Europe's youngest capitals. Today, its contemporary charms include a creative food scene, modern design aesthetic and cutting-edge museums.

JULY 1 - 2 Begin your Finnish immersion on the **Esplanade**, a lush greenway flanked by luxury boutiques and cafés—and just steps away from your hotel. During the summer, this boulevard-like park brings all of Helsinki together, and serves as a gateway to some of Helsinki's finest fashion showrooms, antique stores and art galleries. Discover an imaginative collection of contemporary art at the **Kiasma Museum**, which houses works by more than 4,000 international artists. Explore the unique Temppeliaukio Church, a fascinating work of modern architecture carved directly into the bedrock with a ceiling made entirely out of copper wire.

Stop by **Old Market Hall**, which has operated since the 19th century, and peruse the stalls of seasonal produce and meats. Don't miss nearby Market Square, Helsinki's largest open-air market, where vendors sell freshly caught fish, souvenirs and local delicacies along the waterfront. See the grand Presidential

Palace, the Finnish president's official residence, which was once an imperial palace for Russian tsars. Take a short boat ride to **Suomenlinna**, an imposing 18th-century maritime fortress built on six islands to defend the Kingdom of Sweden from Russia. Explore the highlights of this UNESCO World Heritage site, from the monumental King's Gate at its entrance to one of the oldest operational dry docks in the world.

ACCOMMODATIONS Timeless elegance and European glamour come together at the **Hotel Kämp**. Each beautiful room complements the hotel's stunning 19th-century architecture and contemporary artwork adorns the hallways. Relax in the spa's traditional Finnish sauna and savor the best in European and Asian cuisine.

HELSINKI, FINLAND ✈️ TALLINN, ESTONIA: 10M ✈️ HELSINKI, FINLAND: 10M

TALLINN, ESTONIA

Once a thriving member of the Hanseatic League, Tallinn preserves Estonia's storied past even as this Baltic nation focuses on the future.



Over its 900-year history, Estonia has been ruled by Sweden, Denmark, Russia and Germany with periods of independence. Fly by private jet across the Gulf of Finland to explore the historical heritage of Tallinn.

JULY 3 Constructed between the 13th and the 19th centuries, Tallinn's medieval Old Town offers visitors a window into the past. Wander through the UNESCO World Heritage site's winding cobblestone streets, lined with beautifully preserved red-tiled houses, hidden courtyards and spired churches—many of which date back to the Middle Ages. Admire the impressive medieval fortifications that kept residents safe from invading forces, including massive defensive towers and the original city wall. **Tallinn's Old Town** contains more than 20 churches, representing Catholic, Lutheran and Russian Orthodox traditions, as well as the ruins of a 770-year-old Dominican Monastery.

Walk through **Town Hall Square**, the bustling center of the Old Town, and see the only surviving Gothic town hall in northern Europe. Gaze up at one of Tallinn's best-known symbols—the weather vane on the town hall's tower, which depicts a popular figure named Old Thomas, who is widely regarded as the city's guardian. Look for handicrafts, jewelry and confections in the charming lanes between historic buildings. Explore the contrasts of Tallinn's modern city center, where medieval churches and skyscrapers compete for real estate, before returning to the **Hotel Kämp** in Helsinki by private jet for the night.

HELSINKI, FINLAND ✈️ REYKJAVIK, ICELAND: 3H 30M

REYKJAVIK, ICELAND

Reykjavik may be one of Europe's smallest capitals, but its residents have a big-city mentality that spills into café-lined streets late into the summer evenings.



The world's northernmost capital enjoys 22 hours of sunlight during the summer, allowing plenty of time to explore Reykjavik's modern dining scene and embark on outdoor adventures.

JULY 4 - 6 Start with a visit to the Old City and the **Arbaer Open Air Museum**, where historically-typical wooden houses and museum exhibits highlight the traditional side of Iceland and its unique history. Relax in the geothermic hot springs of the **Blue Lagoon**, whose warm, mineral-rich waters offer the perfect setting to ease any travel discomforts, or visit Heimdörk Nature Reserve for an afternoon jaunt through spruce trees and lava fields. At Thingvellir National Park, stand on the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, where the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates meet. This expansive rift valley, surrounded by high cliffs, is where Iceland's open-air parliament met annually for more than 800 years.

From black-sand beaches to rugged fjords, Iceland's stunning landscapes have been largely shaped by volcanic activity over millions of years. See the geothermal fields of Geysir, still bubbling

with hot springs and mud pots, and refresh in the mists of the majestic **Gullfoss**, Iceland's iconic cascading waterfall. Weather permitting, set off on a snowmobiling safari across the eastern part of Langjökull Glacier. Visit a geothermal plant to learn how Iceland harnesses its natural resources or try your hand at preparing local specialties in a Nordic cooking class.

ACCOMMODATIONS As Reykjavik's first luxury property, the **Hotel Borg** encapsulates timeless elegance. Polished and elegant, rooms feature Art Deco design throughout as well as custom-made furniture and original photographs of the hotel from the 1930s.

REYKJAVIK, ICELAND ✈️ KANGERLUSSUAQ, GREENLAND: 2H 10M

ILULISSAT, GREENLAND

There are few places more remote than Greenland, sitting near the top of the world, with its unparalleled, wild natural beauty.



The world's largest island, Greenland is a stunning landscape of craggy icefjords, freshly formed icebergs and pristine glaciers that come alive under the midnight sun.

JULY 7 - 8 Land in Kangerlussuaq, a town of about 500 residents in western Greenland, and take a charter flight to Ilulissat. Located more than 200 miles north of the Arctic Circle, this remote town on Disko Bay sits next to the Ilulissat Icefjord, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Marvel at the scale of this endlessly white landscape on a flightseeing tour over the **Ilulissat Icefjord**—the best way to take in the grand scale of where the massive Sermeq Kujalleq glacier meets the ocean. Embark on an easy hike to the world's fastest moving glacier and the source of many of Greenland's icebergs.

Cruise past the expansive **Eqi Glacier** for a rare opportunity to see icebergs in formation as they dramatically break off the glacier's edge and crash into the ocean. An iceberg's color depends on how much air is trapped inside, so look for shades of white and ethereal blue as you sail past the glacier. Meet a dogsledding team, still

the most practical mode of transport over Greenland's largely icy terrain. Take a longer guided walk to the Inuit settlement of **Sermermiut** and learn about the indigenous people who have lived in Greenland for thousands of years.

ACCOMMODATIONS Perched on the edge of Greenland's Ilulissat Ice Fjord overlooking Disko Bay, the **Hotel Arctic** is one of the world's northernmost accommodations. Enjoy the spectacular views of the nearby town and the iceberg-dotted harbor from comfortable guest rooms and the hotel's restaurants, where you can try traditional Greenlandic foods.

BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS

Wrap up your journey in historic Boston, one of the oldest cities in the United States.



One of the most historically important cities in the United States, venerable Boston balances traditional New England charm with a distinctive contemporary culture.

JULY 9 - 10 The conclusion of your international adventure brings you to Boston. The gateway to New England, Boston offers numerous opportunities to explore history related to the creation of the United States, including the **Freedom Trail**. Sample Boston's diverse culinary offerings, from classic oyster bars to family-owned Italian bakeries in the city's North End. For a change of pace, shop on **Newbury Street** or stroll through the Public Garden.

ACCOMMODATIONS Overlooking Boston's Public Garden and within easy reach of the city's premier attractions, the luxurious **Four Seasons Hotel Boston** reflects an elegant and distinctive style. Enjoy convenient access to Newbury Street's renowned shopping enclave, Charles Street's charm and the vibrant Theater District.
